- ✓ Attend an in-person volunteer interview with one of our Enrollment staff

FQAs

What is the Christel House Academy / Big Brothers Big Sisters Lunch Buddy Program?

The Lunch Buddy program matches an adult volunteer with a child needing a mentor. The “buddies” have lunch together once a week at the child’s school during the school year. National studies have shown that children in lunch buddy programs have a dramatic increase in self-confidence, an improvement in attitude toward peers and authority figures and teachers report that the child’s grades improve.

How will this work?

The Lunch Buddy program allows volunteers to spend 30-45 minutes eating lunch with a CHA student. Lunch Buddies meet once each week, or twice a month, during the child's lunch period at the school.

Exact times of the lunch depend on the age level of the student who the volunteer is matched with.

Where is the Academy located?

We are located on the near-Southside of the city at 2717 S East St, Indianapolis, IN 46225. We are behind the Super K-Mart on US31, just south of Garfield Park.
